## **POSTGAME NOTES**

## Game 4: Oklahoma 7, Michigan 1

- No. 1-ranked and top-seeded Oklahoma beat NCAA Tournament No. 8 seed Michigan 7-1 in Game 4 of the Women's College World Series. OU improved to 53-4 on the year while UM fell to 50-12.
- The Sooners are now 2-0 against the Wolverines in the WCWS and trail 12-7 in the overall series. Making its
  eighth WCWS appearance, Oklahoma is now 12-12 all-time in the event. Michigan fell to 8-19 in its 10th
  WCWS.
- Oklahoma senior pitcher Keilani Ricketts (32-1) threw the 16th no-hitter in WCWS history and the first since 2007, when two were recorded on the same day. The no-hitter was Ricketts' sixth of the season and seventh of her career. Ricketts surrendered an unearned run and two walks. She struck out 12 batters for her 14th 10-plus strikeout game this season and the 77th of her career.
- OU improved to 51-0 this season when scoring at least three runs in a game.
- The Sooners have now outscored their opponents 451-67 on the year. In six NCAA postseason games this year, they have accumulated a 66-9 run advantage.
- Michigan scored the game's first run as junior Lyndsay Doyle garnered an RBI in the third inning on a fielder's choice, scoring freshman Sierra Lawrence.
- In the third inning, Oklahoma plated four runs. Sophomore Georgia Casey sent a single to left field to score senior Brianna Turang from third base and tie the game at 1-1. Junior Brittany Williams added another run as drove in sophomore Lauren Chamberlain with a single. Senior Jessica Shults then added a two-run single, increasing OU's lead to 4-1.
- Chamberlain blasted a two-run home run in the fourth inning, giving the Sooners a 6-1 lead. It was her 58th
  career home run and 28th this season. The RBI tied Chamberlain with Samantha Ricketts for the Big 12 and
  school single-season record of 81, a mark Ricketts set in 2007. Chamberlain ranks second at OU in career
  home runs, trailing Shults by just three.
- Sophomore Callie Parsons added an RBI-single in the fifth inning, putting OU up 7-1.
- Michigan sophomore pitcher Sara Driesenga (30-8) gave up nine hits and seven runs in six innings of work. She also struck out five batters and walked three.
- The game marked the second time Michigan has been no-hit in the WCWS, the last coming in 1998.
- Oklahoma will face Texas Friday at 8:30 p.m., while Michigan will play Arizona State in an elimination game Saturday at 1:30 p.m.
- Tonight's attendance of 8,860 set a Session 2 record. Total attendance for today's first two sessions was 16,771, a Day 1 record (the previous record of 16,384 was set last year).
