POSTGAME NOTES

Game 6: Oklahoma 10, Texas 2 (5 Innings)

- No. 1-ranked and top-seeded Oklahoma run-ruled NCAA Tournament No. 4 seed Texas 10-2 in five innings to advance in the WCWS winners' bracket. OU improved to 54-4 overall and to 3-1 against Texas on the year, while UT fell to 50-9.
- OU has run-ruled its opponent in five of its seven NCAA postseason games. It has outscored its foes 76-11.
- Oklahoma has trailed twice this year in NCAA postseason play, both times in the WCWS. It fell behind to Michigan 1-0 Thursday in the top of the third inning before immediately scoring four runs in the bottom half of the frame. Texas took a 2-0 lead in the top of the third today before the Sooners plated six runs in the bottom of the inning.
- Oklahoma senior pitcher Keilani Ricketts improved to 33-1 on the year and to 131-35 in her career. She gave up two runs on three hits and four walks while striking out two in 5.0 innings of work.
- Oklahoma sophomore outfielder Callie Parsons was 2-for-3 today from the No. 8 spot in the lineup with a career-high three RBIs. Her two-out single in the third drove in two runs and gave OU a 3-2 lead.
- Texas senior pitcher Blaire Luna entered the game with a 1.22 ERA but surrendered three earned runs (four total) in just 2.0 innings of work. She gave up three hits and walked five while striking out two. Fellow senior Kim Bruins threw 1.2 innings of relief and gave up five runs (three earned) on four hits and two walks.
- The Sooners have now outscored their opponents 461-69 on the year.
- OU improved to 52-0 this season when scoring at least three runs.
- The Sooners' 10 runs marked their most ever in a WCWS game, surpassing the previous high of seven two nights ago against Michigan. The 10 runs surrendered by Texas were its most of the season and its most in a WCWS game.
- Oklahoma has scored at least seven runs in all seven NCAA postseason games this year.
- OU's +65 run differential in this year's NCAA postseason is by far the largest of any of the WCWS teams. The next largest differential entering tonight's games is +28 by Tennessee.
- Oklahoma will face the Game 10 winner on Sunday at 8:30 p.m. CT, while Texas will play the winner of tonight's Florida-Nebraska game on Sunday at noon in an elimination contest.
- Today's attendance of 9,587 set a WCWS single-session record. The previous mark of 9,310 was set last year during Session 5 (Saturday evening). Total attendance for this year's first three sessions is 26,358, ahead of last year's figure of 25,593 through the same number of sessions.
