POSTGAME NOTES

Game 11: Florida 6, Baylor 3

- In the 11th game of the 2014 Women's College World Series, No. 5 seed Florida defeated No. 13 seed Baylor, 6-3. The Gators improved to 53-12 overall this year, while the loss ended the Bears' season. Baylor finished the year with a 49-16 mark.
- With the win, the Gators advanced to the WCWS Championship Series and will face No. 1 seed Oregon or No. 2 seed Alabama in the best-of-three series. Game 1 is scheduled for Monday at 7 p.m. CT (ESPN2). The finals appearance will be the third for Florida, with the others coming in 2009 (lost to Washington) and 2011 (lost to Arizona State).
- In its sixth WCWS appearance (2008, '09, '10, '11, '13, '14), Florida improved to 15-11 all-time in the event (3-0 this season). Baylor finished 2-2 in this year's tournament, its third WCWS appearance (2007, '11, '14). It fell to 5-6 all-time at the event. The win over Baylor was the second for Florida in this year's WCWS. The Gators also defeated the Bears in Thursday's Game 1 by an 11-0 score in five innings.
- Florida starting pitcher Hannah Rogers improved to 29-8 this season, throwing her third complete game of this
 year's WCWS. The senior gave up three runs (all earned) on five hits and one walk while striking out two.
 Rogers is the NCAA active career wins leader with 126.
- Florida senior Stephanie Tofft drove in the game's first run with a two-out double in the third inning. Tofft
 finished the game 2 for 3 with two RBIs and one run scored. She is 11 for 24 (.458) with 8 RBIs in nine NCAA
 Tournament games this year
- Florida junior Briana Little sent a triple to the center field wall in the fourth inning and scored on a base hit from sophomore Aubree Munro, increasing the Gators' lead to 2-0. Little was 2 for 3 on the day with two runs. She is 4 for 8 in this year's WCWS.
- With two outs in the top of the fifth inning, sophomore Taylor Schwarz belted a three-run double to give Florida a 5-0 advantage. She has a team-high-tying four RBIs in this year's WCWS.
- Junior Jordan Strickland put Baylor on the board with an RBI-double in the fifth inning, cutting Florida's lead to 5-1. The run ended a 22.2 scoreless innings streak by the Florida defense. The last run the Gators had surrendered came on Sunday, May 25, in the fifth inning of the second Super Regional game against Washington.
- Later in the fifth inning, junior Kaitlyn Thumann singled in two runs to draw the Bears within two, 5-3. The RBIs were her first of this year's WCWS.
- Baylor starting pitcher Whitney Canion fell to 31-12 in her senior season. Canion pitched a complete game, allowing six runs (all earned) on eight hits and three walks while striking out five.
