## POSTGAME NOTES

### Game 2: Oregon 3, Florida State 0

- In the second game of the 2014 Women's College World Series, No. 1 seed Oregon defeated No. 8 seed Florida State by a score of 3-0. Oregon moved to 55-7-1 on the year while Florida State is now 55-8.
- With the win, Oregon will next play on Friday at 6 p.m. CT against No. 5 seed Florida. Florida State will face No. 13 seed Baylor at 11 a.m. CT on Saturday.
- Making their third WCWS appearance (1989, 2012, '14), the Ducks improved to 3-4 all-time in the WCWS with the win today. Florida State fell to 6-15 all-time in its eighth WCWS appearance (1987, '90, '91, '92, '93, 2002, '04, '14).
- Oregon opened the scoring in the bottom of the first inning on an RBI groundout by sophomore Janelle Lindvall that plated sophomore Alyssa Gillespie from third base.
- Oregon added its second run in the bottom of the second inning on a single up the middle by freshman Nikki Udria that scored senior Alexa Peterson from second base.
- After hitting a double, Oregon sophomore Koral Costa scored from second on an RBI-double on the ensuing at bat in the fifth inning by Alexa Peterson. The run gave the Ducks a 3-0 lead.
- Sophomore pitcher Cheridan Hawkins improved to 34-4 on the season for Oregon with the victory after pitching a complete game. She allowed one hit and two walks while striking out six. Hawkins retired 16 consecutive Seminoles after a one-out walk in the first inning. Hawkins boasts a 4-0 record this postseason with 36 strikeouts in 30.2 innings (five earned runs).
- Oregon extended its winning streak to seven games, which includes six games in the NCAA postseason. The Ducks have outscored opponents 57-9 during the winning streak (43-6 in the postseason).
- The Ducks' win was their 55th of the year, breaking the previous single-season school record of 54 in 1989.
- Oregon won its opening-round game at the WCWS for the first time in program history.
- The shutout was Oregon's second ever at the WCWS. The Ducks also blanked South Carolina 1-0 in their second game of the 1989 WCWS in Sunnyvale, Calif.
- Oregon has totaled 10 or more hits in six of its last seven contests, including 11 today.
- Maddie O'Brien's game-opening single was Florida State's only hit of the game. It was the Seminoles' season low for hits (previous season low was three on two occasions).
