2020 NFCA DIVISION I LEADOFF CLASSIC

The NFCA Division I Leadoff Classic is back! Presented by Rawlings, the 19th version of the Association's season-opening tournament takes place Feb. 7-9 at the Eddie C. Moore Complex in Clearwater, Fla. The 2020 field features 15 collegiate programs, 10 of which participated in the 2019 postseason, and the United States Women's National Team.

As part of their "Stand Beside Her" Tour in partnership with Major League Baseball, the Red, White and Blue are gearing up for the 2020 Olympics and take on five programs over the three days. The World No. 1 will match up in exhibition contests against Mississippi State, Illinois, Baylor, Kentucky and Texas State. A pair of National Team pitchers - Keilani Ricketts and Cat Osterman - have ties to the Bulldogs and Bobcats, respectively. Ricketts is the younger sister of Mississippi State head coach Samantha, while Osterman is Texas State's pitching coach.

Highlighting the field of collegiate programs is 2019 Women's College World Series participant No. 8 Minnesota, along with No. 15 Kentucky and No. 21 Ole Miss, which reached the Super Regionals. RV Missouri and RV Louisville were regional finalists, while No. 23 Auburn, Illinois, Mississippi State and RV Notre Dame qualified for regionals. The final postseason team from 2019 is Liberty, which took part in the Championship round of the NISC.

Rounding out the field of collegiate programs is RV Baylor, Missouri State, North Carolina State, South Alabama and Texas State. Each team will play a total of five games over three days.

In addition, Liberty head coach Dot Richardson was a member of the 1996 team that won the first-ever Olympic Gold Medal in softball. Coincidentally, 1996 was the first year the NFCA hosted the Leadoff Classic in Columbus, Ga., the competition site for softball at the Atlanta Olympic Games. The Washington Huskies, with the help of then-senior and current U.S. assistant coach Heather Tarr, were crowned winners of the inaugural tournament.

The first 15 tournaments were held in Columbus, Ga. from 1996 through 2010 before moving to Clearwater from 2012-14. One team in this year's field, Notre Dame, participated in the first-ever Leadoff Classic, while another, Illinois, captured the 2010 title. Michigan has captured the most titles with four, while Louisiana, Stanford and Washington each came out on top twice.

Established in 1983, the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) is the professional growth organization for fastpitch softball coaches from all competitive levels of play. The national office, located in the Crescent Hill community of Louisville, Ky., moved to the Bluegrass State in 2012.

Although collegiate coaches comprised the majority of the organization's membership in the early days, today they are joined by high school, travel ball, professional and international coaches, along with umpires, clubs, businesses and fans of fastpitch softball. Growing from 40 members in 1983 to over 5,800 today, the NFCA boasts members from all 50 states and several international countries.

There are many services offered to the membership. Highlighted by the All-America teams, the awards program is about recognizing student-athletes for their athletic and academic prowess and coaches for their contributions both on and off the field.

Education is one of the NFCA's highest priorities. It hosts an annual National Convention in December, conducts eight coaches clinics and provides in-person and online educational classes (NFCC) for its members. The Association also runs collegiate and high school tournaments and hosts skills and academic camps throughout the nation. Additionally, the NFCA works with USA Today in producing polls for NCAA Division I and high school softball as well as compiling NCAA Division II and Division III national polls.

HEAD COACH Ken Eriksen 10th Year

Head coach of the United States Women's National Team since 2011, Ken Eriksen leads the Red, White and Blue in their return to the Olympics this July in Tokyo.

Joining USA Softball in 2002,

Eriksen is establishing himself as one of the winningest coaches in USA Softball Women's National Team history, currently sitting second in all-time wins and compiling a 52-4 record at the helm of Team USA in major competitions. Eriksen has guided Team USA to a pair of gold medals each at the WBSC World Championships and Pan American Gmes.

As the longtime head coach at the University of South Florida, coach Eriksen has steered the Bulls to 975 victories, 14 NCAA postseason berths, two Super Regionals and one Women's College World Series in 23 seasons.



HEAD COACH Mickey Dean 3rd Season/Elon '87

Mickey Dean enters his third season in the Auburn dugout. In two seasons, he has guided the Tigers to 80 victories and two NCAA Regionals.

Overall, Dean has led his programs to 558 wins, nine NCAA Regionals, two 50-win seasons and seven 40-win seasons. During his five-year stint at James Madison, Dean complied a record of 237-56 (.809) and steered the Dukes to a Super Regional in 2016. He amassed five 40-win seasons, including the final two campaigns with 52 and 50 victories, respectively.

Prior to JMU, Dean spent six seasons as the head coach at Radford where he took the Highlanders to their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearances in 2009 and 2010. Dean also served as an assistant coach at Akron (2001-02), Indiana (2002-04) and Longwood (2005-06).

Dean has worked on the professional and international level. He was the pitching coach for the Venezuelan National Team (2002-08) as well as the head coach for the Chicago Bandits (2004-10) that finished as the National Pro Fastpitch regular season champions five times and won the title in 2008.

HEAD COACH Glenn Moore 20th Season Northwestern State '93

Glenn Moore is in his 20th season as head coach at Baylor and his 23rd full season as a collegiate softball head coach. Moore, who was selected to guide the Lady Bears'

program in June 2000, begins the 2020 season with a career record of 895-414 (.684), including a 756-372 (.670) record at Baylor. Guiding the program to four Women's College World Series appearances, his teams have had a winning record in all but one season of his Division I coaching career. He is Baylor Athletics' active all-time wins leader across all sports. He has progressed up the active and overall NCAA coaching ranks, now ranking No. 17 in winning percentage and No. 26 in total victories.

During Moore's tenure, the Lady Bears have received 17 CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, 16 National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-America Honors and 65 NFCA All-Region honors. In addition, Baylor players have earned 86 all-conference selections during his tenure, while numerous Lady Bears have earned academic all-conference honors.

Prior to coming to Baylor, Moore spent two-plus seasons as head coach at LSU and four years total with the Tigers' program. Moore led LSU to the Southeastern Conference championship in 1999 and 2000. While at LSU, Moore amassed a 117-25 (.820) record.

HEAD COACH Tyra Perry 5th Season/LSU '97

Tyra Perry was hired as the University of Illinois' second-ever head coach in June, 2015. Entering her 19th season as a NCAA Division I softball head coach and fifth at the helm of the Illini, Perry has totaled

over 500 career victories as the head coach at Illinois, Ball State, Western Kentucky and Birmingham Southern.

With 145 victories on her belt, Perry has made an immediate impact in her time at the helm of Illini softball, leading the program to its first back-to-back NCAA Regional appearances since 2010 (2016 & 2017) and three times in four seasons.

Perry led the 2017 squad to a 39-20 record, tying for the fourth-most wins in program history and a top-four finish in the Big Ten Conference, while also advancing to the conference tournament semifinals for the first time since 2004. In her first season, she guided Illinois to its first NCAA Regional appearance since 2010.

During her two seasons at Ball State, Perry, the 2014 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year, directed the Cardinals to 67 wins with a combined nine All-MAC selections and 13 Academic All-MAC honorees.

Prior to Ball State, the two-time SunBelt Coach of the Year spent six seasons as head coach at Western Kentucky, guiding the Lady Toppers to 196 victories and its first-ever NCAA Regional appearance. She also led Birmingham-Southern to 146 triumphs.

HEAD COACH Rachel Lawson 13th Season/UMass '94

Entering her 13th season as UK's head coach in 2020, Lawson's vision for the UK softball program has become a realization. The winningest head coach in program history has not only lead UK to its first-ever

appearance in the Women's College World Series, seven NCAA Super Regionals the last nine seasons, including a program-best 50 wins in 2014, but UK's administration came through on their promise and commitment to softball by providing Lawson with one of the nation's greatest collegiate softball facilities in John Cropp Stadium.

She became the first coach in program history to eclipse 400 wins at Kentucky. In 2019, Kentucky had one of its best offensive seasons ever – setting the school record for runs scored, batting average, on-base percentage, slugging and trying the program best with 71 home runs. Abbey Cheek was named the 2019 NFCA Schutt Sports and SEC Player of the Year, becoming the first player under Lawson to win a conference and national Player of the Year honor. Additionally, UK made its third-straight NCAA Super Regional and swept its way through the Lexington Regional for a third-straight season.

Six of the last seven seasons, Lawson has led the Wildcats to a national seed in the NCAA Tournament. The school's first-ever national seed was in 2013 - and UK hosted an NCAA Regional for the first time ever. Kentucky, which has made the NCAA Tournament each of the last 11 seasons, is one of just 18 schools nationally to claim that honor.

HEAD COACH Dot Richardson 7th Season/UCLA '84

Dot Richardson was named the fifth head coach in the history of the Lady Flames softball program on July 17, 2013.

During her time at Liberty, Richardson has helped guide a

resurgence of the softball program. The Lady Flames have improved in the win-loss column nearly every year under her guidance. Entering the 2020 season, Richardson has led the Lady Flames to a 206-164 overall record.

Liberty is one of just 13 NCAA Division I softball teams to win 40 or more games in 2017, 2018 and 2019, and is 13th in the nation with 135 wins over that three-year span.

In 2019, Richardson helped Liberty make an immediate impact on the ASUN Conference, as the Lady Flames went 40-22 overall and finished second in conference standings at 16-5. The Lady Flames claimed their second NISC Regional title in the last three years, not allowing a single run in winning the Lynchburg Regional.

She was instrumental in the planning for the state-of-the-art Liberty Softball Stadium, which debuted during the 2015 season. Liberty Softball Stadium, a 1,000-seat structure, opened March 19, 2015 with the Lady Flames defeating Rider, 9-2.

Holly Aprile enters her second season at the helm of the Louisville softball program.

Aprile's Cardinals enjoyed a successful 2019 campaign, highlighted by an at-large bid to the

NCAA tournament and a regional final appearance. The team amassed a 35-23 overall record and a 12-12 mark in ACC play for a third-place finish in the league's Atlantic Division and fifth in the overall conference standings. Louisville's 35 wins marked the most victories in a season since 2016 when the Cards posted a 35-17 record.

In the midst of a challenging schedule, the Cards collected six wins against teams ranked in the top 25 including a pair of contests against then-No. 3/3 Florida State. With the series win, Louisville became the first ACC team to claim a series against the Seminoles since 2012. Other ranked wins included No. 15/17 Michigan, No. 24/19 Virginia Tech, No. 24/23 Kentucky and No. 18/17 Northwestern.

Aprile came to Louisville from the University of Pittsburgh, where she spent 10 seasons (2009-18) as the Panthers' head coach and five years (2004-08) as an assistant. In 2018, she earned ACC Coach of the Year honors after leading Pitt to the ACC Coastal Division title and a runner-up finish in the conference tournament where it fell in the championship game to eventual national champion Florida State.



historic heights in her second season leading the program. Minnesota finished the year 46-14 and its first Women's College World Series appearance in the NCAA era.

Trachsel coached five All-Big Ten honorees and five NFCA Great Lakes All-Region honorees. Under Trachsel's watch, Amber Fiser was also named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and a First Team All-American.

The Gophers closed out the 2019 season ranked No. 8 in both the USA Today/NFCA Top-25 Coaches Poll and the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top-25 Poll. The No. 8 ranking is the highest the Gophers have finished a season in either major poll. They also finished No. 7 in the NCAA RPI, which is not only the highest RPI to finish a season, but the highest at any point in program history. Trachsel and her staff were named the NFCA Great Lakes All-Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

The Gophers have also made history in the classroom under Trachsel. Their team GPA of 3.63 set in the spring of 2019 was the highest in program history. Eleven different players notched 2019 Academic All-Big Ten honors.

Samantha Ricketts, one of the rising coaching stars in college softball who has directed the most explosive offenses in Mississippi State history, was named the Bulldogs' sixth head softball coach on

July 22, 2019.

Ricketts served as MSU's assistant coach from 2015-18 focusing on hitting and recruiting before being promoted to associate head coach on July 30, 2018. The San Jose, California, native has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, six NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career.

MSU has become of the nation's elite offensive teams under Ricketts' watch. In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set several single-season offensive records. Last season under her watch, Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson became one of the most dynamic duos in the nation. MSU joined Arizona as the only clubs in the nation to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs. The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history.

Prior to joining the Bulldogs, Ricketts served as an assistant coach at Wichita State from 2012-14, working with the team's hitters and consistently improving their production.

HEAD COACH Larissa Anderson 2nd Season/Gannon '97

A new era in Mizzou Softball began in the summer of 2018, as Larissa Anderson was named the 10th head coach to lead the tradition-rich Tiger program.

As Anderson enters year two in

Columbia, Mo., that new era is well underway, and her ability to change the culture of the program in such a short time was a big reason why.

Anderson finished her first season in the Black & Gold with a 35-25 record, the most wins for the Tigers in a single-season since 2016, along with a fourth-place finish in the SEC. She guided the Tigers to their 13th straight regional appearance, pushing host No. 2 UCLA to a winner-take-all game seven.

In four seasons as Hofstra's head coach, Anderson fashioned a 130-73-1 (.640) record with a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, two Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles and four winning seasons. She picked up her 100th career win with the Pride's 7-2 win over Boston University, March 17, 2018, and posted seven career wins over nationally-ranked opponents, including three in 2018—a 1-0 victory over then-No. 13 Florida State on March 2 and a pair at No. 22 James Madison to claim the CAA Tournament crown.

In her 17 years on the Hofstra staff, Pride hurlers won nine CAA Pitcher of the Year awards in 10 seasons, including four consecutive wins by Olivia Galati from 2010-13 and three from Kayleigh Lotti from 2007-09.

HEAD COACH Holly Hesse 32nd Season Creighton '82

Head coach Holly Hesse is in her 32nd season leading the Bears' program as the second-winningest coach in Missouri Valley Conference

history with 811 victories.

The 2019 season included a number of highlights for Hesse and the Bears, most notably a thrilling walk-off win over Northern Iowa on March 24 to record her 800th career victory. The Bears also relished their second straight 30-win campaign in 2019, the first time MSU has achieved that feat since reeling off three straight MVC titles from 1996-98.

Missouri State also boasted a pair of All-MVC firstteam selections in 2019 with senior third baseman Kyana Mason and sophomore pitcher Steffany Dickerson earning conference distinction. The pair also went on to NFCA All-Region laurels with Mason landing on the first team and Dickseron on the second team.

She is the winningest coach in Missouri State history with a 811-788-2 (.507) record. Her tenure includes two regular-season MVC titles, five MVC tournament crowns and five NCAA Tournament appearances. Hesse recorded her 300th win in 2000, her 400th win in 2004, her 500th in 2007 and victory number 600 in 2012.

Missouri State leads all schools with 72 wins in the MVC Tournament and Hesse is tied with the most tournament wins at 50.

HEAD COACH Jennifer Patrick-Swift 2nd Season/Methodist '04


Jennifer Patrick-Swift enters her second season as North Carolina State's head coach following seven seasons as Saint Francis' skipper. Patrick-Swift helped lead NC State to the ACC Championship semifinals

in her first season at the helm of the program. The squad compiled 31 wins during the 2019 season, the most for the team in a single season since the 2015 campaign. NC State picked up wins in three ACC series during the regular season before going on to earn its first ACC Championship berth since the 2017 season.

In the 2019 ACC Tournament, Patrick-Swift guided the Wolfpack to a semifinals appearance for the first time since 2017, which included an upset of No. 1 seeded Virginia Tech to become the first eight-seed to reach the semifinals of the tournament since 2011.

In her final two seasons at Saint Francis, Patrick-Swift guided the Red Flash to back-to-back conference championship titles and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, both firsts in program history. She ended her tenure on a 38-game Northeast Conference win streak, which is the fourth-longest streak in NCAA Division I history.

Overall, she racked up 226 wins in her seven seasons at the helm of Saint Francis and was named ECAC (Eastern College Athletic Conference) Coach of the Year while leading the NEC Coaching Staff of the Year in 2017 and NFCA Great Lakes Region Staff of the Year in 2018.

In her 19th season as leader of the Notre Dame softball program, Deanna Gumpf continues to ascend the ladder as one of the nation's premier head coaches.

Under Gumpf's guidance the

Irish have made 18 consecutive trips to NCAA Regionals, claiming four conference tournament titles during that span. Even more, Notre Dame staked claim to the BIG EAST Conference's regular-season championship during her first four seasons on the bench (2002-05). The Irish hoisted BIG EAST regular-season hardware again in 2010, 2011, and the program's final year as a conference member in 2013 before transitioning to the Atlantic Coast Conference prior to the 2014 campaign.

The Notre Dame coaching staff has received nine prominent honors during Gumpf's tenure, being tabbed as the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Mideast Region Coaching Staff of the Year in 2002 and 2004, the NFCA Mid-Atlantic Region Coaching Staff of the Year in 2014, 2016 and 2017 (co), and the BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year in 2002, 2004, 2011 and 2013.

Gumpf has compiled a career record of 739-312-1 in her 18 seasons at Notre Dame, placing her among the elite skippers in the NCAA. In 2018, she joined Hall of Fame women's basketball mentor Muffet McGraw as the only coaches in Notre Dame's fabled history to win 700 or more games.



Ruben Felix was named the interim head coach of Ole Miss softball on December 8, 2019 after spending five seasons as an assistant coach for the Rebels, including associate head coach and recruiting coordinator.

Along the way up, Felix has played a major role in the Rebels' unprecedented success the last four seasons. Felix has helped the Rebels to a pair of NCAA Super Regionals (2017, 2019), two NCAA Regional Championships (2017, 2019), the 2017 SEC Tournament Championship and the only four NCAA Tournament appearances in program history.

Part of the reason for the success was a significant uptick in every imaginable offensive category from the previous season. The Rebels set program records for doubles (67), triples (23), RBIs (284) and steals (126), with numerous players enjoying career years. Kylan Becker put a bow on one of the most decorated careers in program history, becoming the second player in Ole Miss history to be named an NFCA All-American, receiving a First Team nod. Felix came to Ole Miss prior to the 2015 season after four seasons as the top softball assistant coach & recruiting coordinator at the University of Central Florida. In two of his last three seasons at UCF, Felix helped the Knights advance to the NCAA tournament.



HEAD COACH Becky Clark 14th Season/Mobile '91


Over the past 13 seasons of competitive action, the University of South Alabama softball program has only seen one person at the helm; Becky Clark.

Clark has been there since the

program's infancy in 2007, raising it to one of the most respected mid-majors, claiming three Sun Belt Conference Tournament titles (2012, '13 and '15) and advancing to the NCAA Regional final four times (2012, '13, '14 and '15) under her direction. The Jaguars have also eclipsed the 40-win mark four times during that span.

Clark was named head coach for the Jaguar program in the summer of 2005, prior to the team's first season. Over that stretch, the Jag skipper has steered the program to undeniable competitive success in a short time, in addition to creating a culture that carries over into the classroom. In her 13 seasons at South Alabama, Clark has amassed an overall record of 429-272-1, while also accumulating a Sun Belt record of 166-132. During her 16 seasons as a head coach, Clark has registered an overall competitive record of 585-305-2 combined at her two coaching stints.

The Jaguars have also excelled in the classroom under Clark as USA has had 95 student-athletes named to the Sun Belt Conference Commissioner's list, 73 student-athletes earn Sun Belt Conference Academic Honor Roll honors and 86 players named to the NFCA All-America Scholar list, an award given to student-athletes that acquire at least a 3.5 grade-point average or higher during the academic year.

In 19 years at the helm of the Texas State softball program, head coach Ricci Woodard has guided the program to a 670-420-1 record, 12 conference championships and eight

NCAA Regional Championship appearances.

Woodard has developed 82 all-conference sections, 26 all-region honorees, four NFCA All-Americans and three CoSIDA Academic All-Americas. In addition, Woodard has earned five coach of the year awards.

Texas State finished the 2019 season with an overall record of 29-25 and a league record of 16-10. The Bobcats earned the No. 4 seed in the 2019 Sun Belt Conference Championship. Woodard helped manage three selections to the 2019 Second Team All-Sun Belt Conference team. Junior outfielder Christiana McDowell, also named Third Team NFCA All-Central Region, sophomore infielder Tara Oltmann, and sophomore pitcher Meagan King all collected league laurels following the season.

Prior to coaching her current post with Texas State, Woodard served as an assistant coach at the University of Oregon for four seasons. In her first collegiate coaching experience, Woodard helped lead the Ducks to three consecutive national top 25 finishes and three consecutive appearances in the NCAA Regional Championships.
